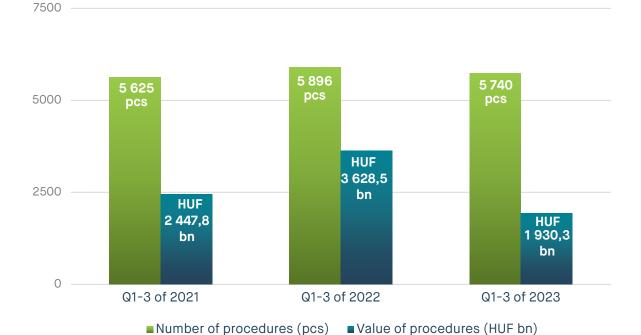

I. THE VOLUME OF HUNGARIAN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

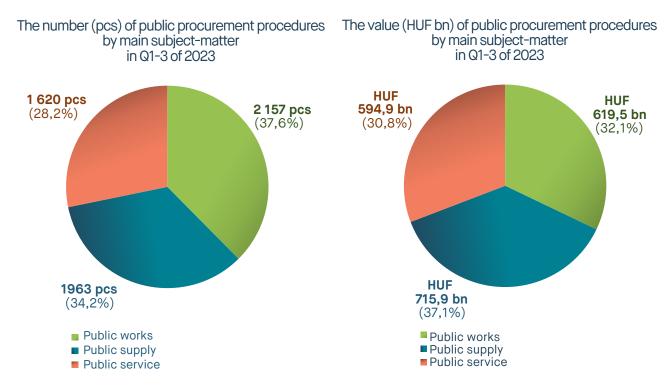
1. The number (pcs) and value (HUF bn) of effective public procurement procedures in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

The number (pcs) and value (HUF bn) of effective public procurement procedures in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

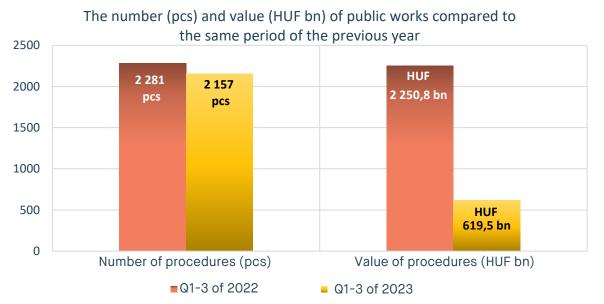


In the first three quarters of 2023, contracting authorities conducted 5740 effective public procurement procedures, which is only 2,6% lower than the data measured in the same period of last year. The final total value of these procedures amounted to HUF 1930,3 billion, which is about half of the value of the same period in 2022.

2. The number (pcs) and value (HUF bn) of public procurement procedures by main subject-matter in Q1-3 of 2023



The **breakdown of subject-matters was relatively consistent** in the first three quarters of 2023: public works accounted for 37,6% of the number and 32,1% of the value of public procurement, public supply explained 34,2% of the number and 37,1% of the value of procedures, while 28,2% of the number and 30,8% of the value of public procurement was public service.

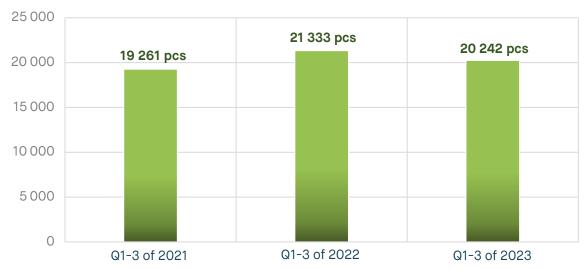


The number of public works public procurement in the first three quarters of 2023 was only 5,4% lower than in the same period of last year, however, **the value of public works significantly dropped**.



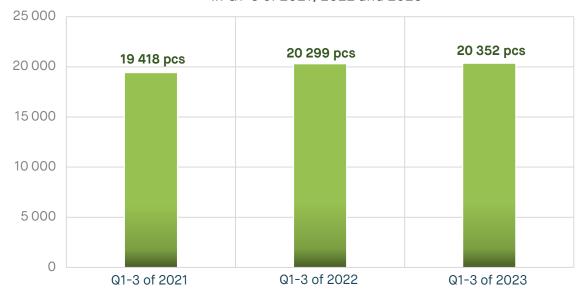
3. Transparency and publicity: data on the number of notices in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023





In total 20242 notices were registered and processed in the first three quarters of 2023, in relation to 5740 effective public procurement procedures.

The number (pcs) of requests for the supply of missing information issued by the Public Procurement Authority during notice control in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023



In the first three quarters of 2023, the Public Procurement Authority issued 20352 requests for the supply of missing information, so as a result of the strict and consequent control practice, the number of requests for the supply of missing information exceeded the number of notices, that is at least one request for the supply of missing information was related to each notice.

II. THE SME SECTOR CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

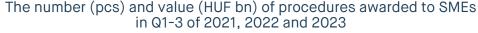
1. The ratio of public procurement awarded to SMEs in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

84 out of 100 effectively conducted public procurement procedures were awarded to SMEs in the first three quarters of 2023, which almost equals the data in the same period of the previous year, while 68 forints out of 100 forints spent on public procurement were awarded to SMEs, which is 19 more than in the first three quarters of 2022. The role of the SME sector in Hungarian public procurement is well illustrated by the fact that despite economic difficulties both the number and value of public procurement awarded to SMEs accounts for a considerable ratio.

III. COMPETITION IS ENSURED

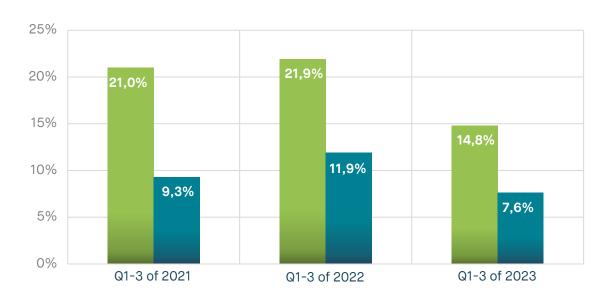
1. Data on the number and value of one bid public procurement in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

The trend of one bid public procurement procedures is a critical index of competition in the public procurement market, therefore the Public Procurement Authority continuously monitors the data of the related ratio. The Public Procurement Authority publishes several key indicators in its reports, which characterise the intensity of public procurement competition. One of such indicators is the tendency of one bid public procurement. The Authority analyses this indicator by applying two methodologies: on the one hand, it considers entire public procurement procedures in line with its previous practice; on the other hand, it considers public contracts as in the Single Market Scoreboard of the European Commission. Thus, the trend of one bid public procurement is presented herein by applying both methodologies.

[■] Ratio of the value of contracts (%)

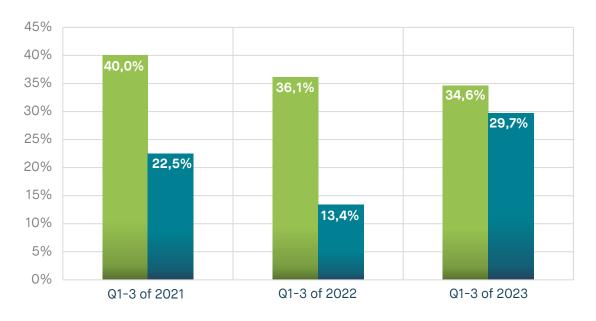
¹ The charts on one bid contracts include estimated data, excluding procedures related to the partial performance of framework agreements, considering that the filter of such procedures can only be done approximately based on the free text content of the notices published by contracting authorities.

² The methodology of the statistics concerning one bid contracts differ from the indicators set in the conditions of the conditionality mechanism of the European Commission, the calculation and monitoring of which does not fall within the competence of the Public Procurement Authority.

■ Ratio of the number of contracts (%) ■ Ratio of the value of contracts (%)

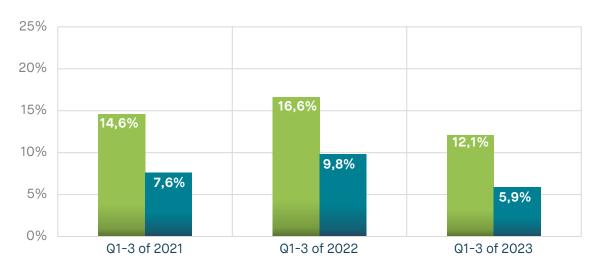
Upon looking at one bid public procurement by applying the contract based methodology of the European Commission – also considering the provisions of Government Decree No. 63/2022. (II. 28.) on measures aimed at reducing the number of one bid public procurement – in the first three quarters of 2023 **there was a slight decrease in the ratio of the number of one bid contracts above EU thresholds**, while below EU thresholds the ratio of both the number and value of one bid contracts was significantly lower than in the same period of the previous year.

Ratio of the number and value of one bid **procedures** below EU thresholds in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

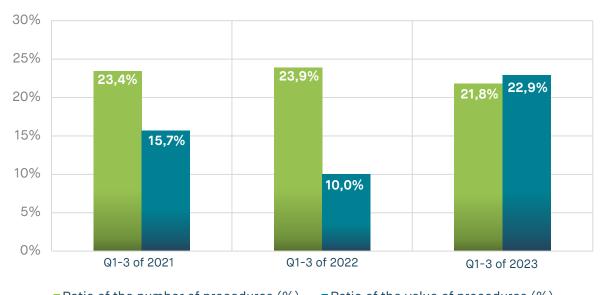




■ Ratio of the number of procedures (%) ■ Ratio of the value of procedures (%)

Ratio of the number and value of one bid <u>procedures</u> above EU thresholds in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023



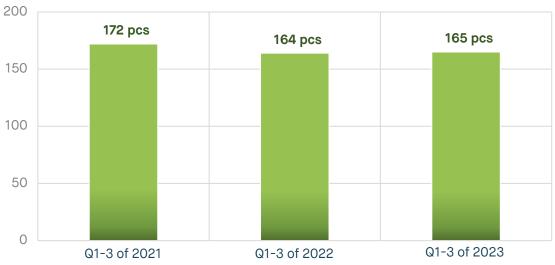

Upon looking at the ratio of one bid procedures in the first three quarters of 2023 by applying the procedure based methodology, there was a minor downturn compared to the same periods of the previous years in terms of the ratio of the number both above and below EU thresholds; nevertheless; there was a modest rise in terms of the ratio of the value above EU thresholds compared to the same period of last year.

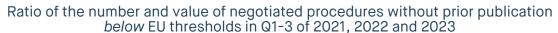
2. Key indicators of negotiated procedures without prior publication in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

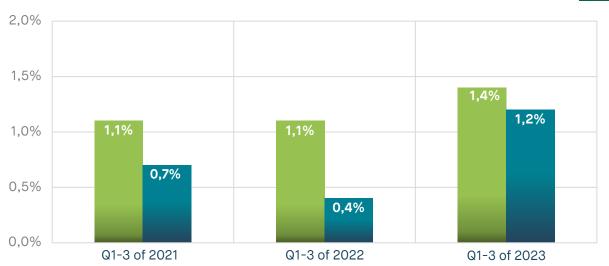




Remark: The number of procedures launched differs from the number of procedures closed due to the carry-over effect.

The other key indicator of competition in the public procurement market is the trend of negotiated procedures without prior publication, in terms of which in the first three quarters of 2023 the number of procedures launched almost equalled the date of the same period of last year.





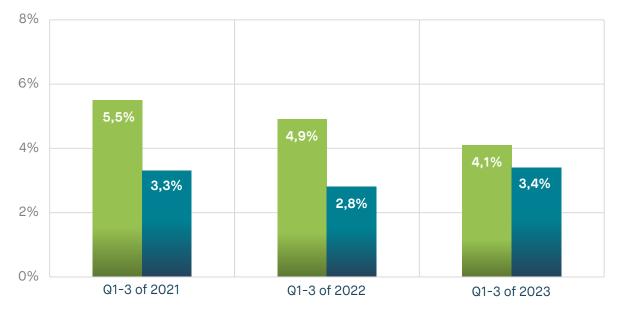
■ Ratio of the number of procedures (%)

■ Ratio of the number of procedures (%)

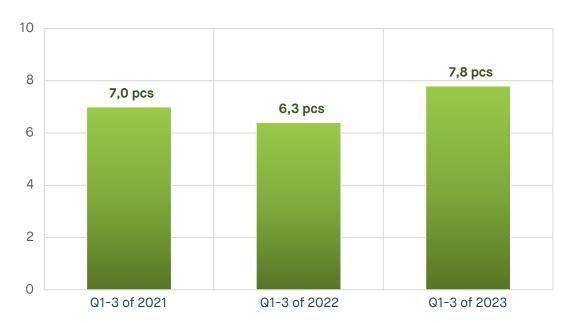

The ratio of the number and value of negotiated procedures without prior publication closed remained low below EU thresholds, just like above EU thresholds, where there was a lowering tendency in terms of the ratio of the number of negotiated procedures without prior publication.



3. The average number of bids per public procurement procedure in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

The number (pcs) of bids per public procurement procedure in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023



The average number of bids was 7,8 in the first three quarters of 2023, which is a considerable rise compared to the same periods of the previous years, close to the average of 8 bids per procedure. The **number of bids per public procurement procedure remains a high level,** which highlights competition in the Hungarian public procurement market.

IV. SUSTAINABILITY ASPECTS IN HUNGARIAN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

The ratio of the number and value of procedures with social aspects below EU thresholds in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023



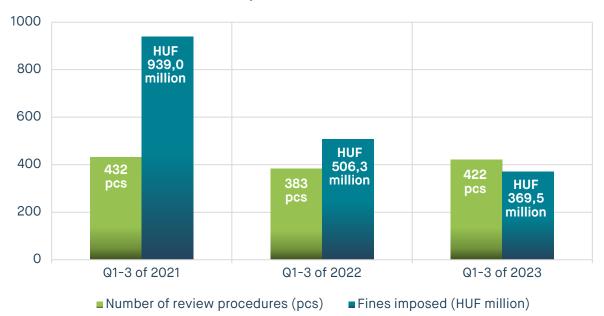

In the first three quarters of 2023, the ratio of the number and value of public procurement with environmental and social aspects below EU thresholds significantly advanced compared to the same period of last year, which well demonstrates that contracting authorities pay more attention to the application of sustainability aspects in Hungarian public procurement. The stable objective of the Public Procurement Authority is the implementation of sustainability aspects, which may also contribute to the reinforcement of environmental and climate protection and economic sustainability.

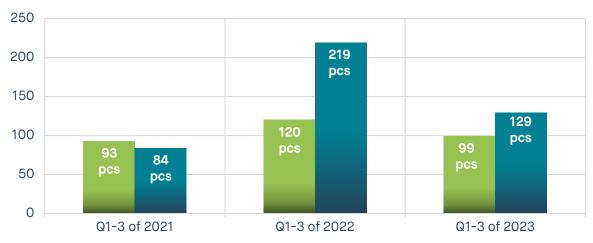

The number (pcs) of review procedures and the value (HUF million) of the fines imposed in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023



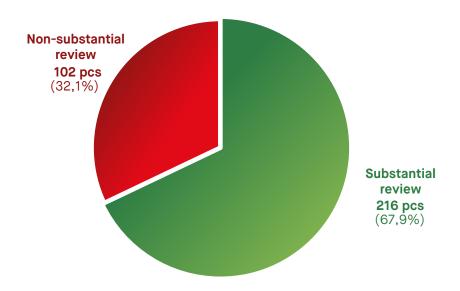
The number (pcs) of review procedures and the value (HUF million) of the fines imposed in Q1-3 of 2021, 2022 and 2023

- ■The total number (pcs) of contracting authorities and economic operators against whom the President initiated a legal review

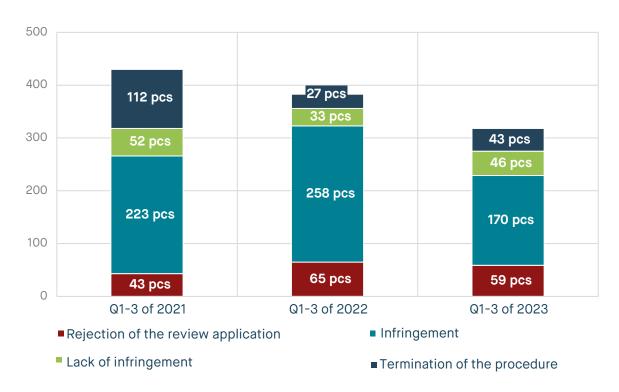

The number (pcs) and breakdown (%) of review procdures closed in Q1-3 of 2023



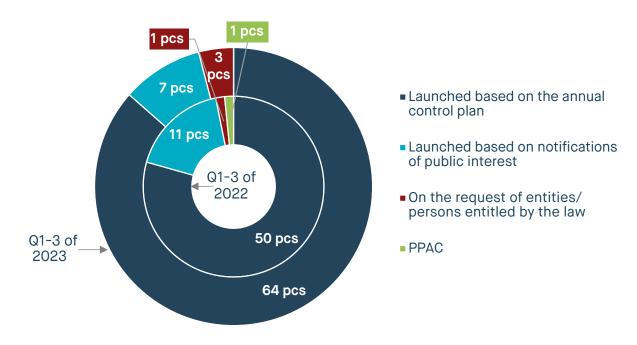
